Port Houston Regular Commission Meeting and Special Public Meeting

Both Meetings to Be Held on Tuesday, May 21

Houston, Texas – The Port Commission of the Port of Houston Authority will hold its Regular Monthly Meeting on Tuesday, May 21, 2024, beginning at 9:15 a.m. Following the Regular Monthly meeting, a Special Public Meeting is expected to start at 10:30 a.m. Both meetings will be held in the boardroom of the Port Houston Executive Office Building, located at 111 East Loop North, Houston, TX 77029.

The sole agenda item for the **Special Public Meeting** is the proposed channel user fee currently in development to help finance the work associated with the ongoing Houston Ship Channel Expansion – Project 11.

Each meeting will be conducted in a hybrid format, allowing the public to attend either in person or virtually via a WebEx webinar. Room capacity is limited to 88 people.
